

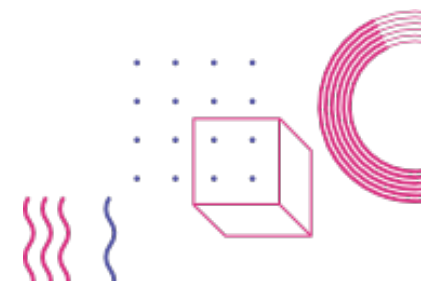
# Campus Premium
